Notes: The Complainant (Angela Spano/GHC Paulding Instructional Site Administrative Assistant II) stated that an unknown person (s) removed and then took the campus camera (Cannon Digital SLR, Model Number Rebel T2i, Serial Number 21-2320-7213) from off of a tripod inside of the 1st Floor Administration Office (Suite 100). She also stated that there has been no indications of forced entry into the office area and that it did not appear anything else was disturbed or taken. The complainant then said that the Theft/Stolen Equipment Incident occurred between the following dates and times: 09/20/2018, after 1710 Hours and 10/01/2018 before 0930 Hours, and that she has no further information available at this time regarding the Theft Incident.

The complainant then advised this officer (Grant, R/GHC PD) that the stolen equipment (Digital Camera) was valued at \$200.00. I advised her that the incident would be investigated further by this officer in a search for additional details and related facts as is available.

A GCIC LEADS Sheet was completed and the stolen equipment will be placed on the computer as stolen. The LEADS sheet and a copy of this report will subsequently be faxed-over to GCIC so that the stolen property could be entered on the computer.

This report was completed for documentation and for an investigatory disposition.

Notes: On October 03, 2018, at approximately 9:17 am, Officer Bitzer was contacted by Georgia Highlands College Staff Member, Stephanie Jordan-Cain, and she advised Officer Bitzer she just saw a Black Dodge Ram 1500, 4 door, 5.7 liter Crew Cab with Construction Racks (Georgia Tag CIR4841/Paulding County) pull into a visitor parking space and hit a 4 Door Silver Lexus RX 350, Georgia Tag BQN8376 on the rear left fender leaving scrape marks. The Lexus was parked in a visitor space next to the Black Dodge Ram. Mrs. Cain then noticed the Black Dodge Ram back out of the parking space and move to another area in the parking lot. Mrs. Cain took pictures of the truck and contacted Campus Safety, Officer Bitzer. Officer Bitzer then drove around the parking lot with Mrs. Cain and found the vehicle matching the picture which was a Black Dodge Ram.

Officer Bitzer then left notes on both vehicles involved and each party came to the Campus Safety Office and gave Officer Bitzer their contact information. Each party also gave a voluntary statement regarding the incident as well.

Mr. Joey Tillman stated he parked his car in visiting parking due to not having a parking decal and upon returning to the vehicle he was driving at approximately 10:55 am he noticed a note on the vehicle he was driving stating that the vehicle had been side swiped.

Mrs. Elisa Borgese stated she parked in visitor parking at approximately 9:15 am and when she pulled into the parking space it seemed too tight of a parking spot. Mrs. Borgese stated she backed out of the parking space not realizing she hit the Lexus RX 350 and she looked in her mirror and everything seemed normal and she moved her vehicle to another parking space that was not next or close to another vehicle.

Notes: On 10/09/2018 at 0845 Hours, I received an email (See Below) from Chief Horace that was sent to him on the previous day (Monday, 10/08/2018) at around 1435 Hours and was sent from Clifton Puckett (GHC Cartersville Campus Student Center Director & Student Life Coordinator).

Email:

"We had a gym altercation earlier today, but I don't have access to cameras here to see what happened, just going off he said/she said for now. Is there a timeline for when I can get the access? Thank you."

I then reached out to Mr. Puckett by phone regarding the email and the related incident and advised him that I will shortly be leaving the Paulding Campus and be enroute to the Cartersville Campus regarding this matter. Upon my arrival, Mr. Puckett put me in contact with the Student Complainant (GHC Student: Christopher B. McDonald, Student ID Number 900150787) who was already standing by for my arrival in the Campus Safety Office with the on-duty campus security officer (Gary Bitzer/Dynamic Security). I asked Christopher McDonald to share with me what occurred on the date, time and location in question.

He said "On Monday 10/08/2018 at 1210 Hours, he was on the Cartersville Campus shooting hoops and practicing non-stop on his basketball skills in the Cartersville Student Center Gym. At approximately 1215 Hours, two unknown male students walked onto the court where he was practicing and literally interrupted his practice session by standing on the court in a manner that impeded his movements to the goal. He said that they literally start playing a two-person game and acted oblivious to his presence. He stated that just prior to their game, he took a shot at the rim that fell short and bounced on the floor and then bounced again and inadvertently struck one of the males (GHC Student: David Lawal, Student ID Number 900131786) on his left arm and he reacted by becoming angry and frowning. He immediately apologized to him but the male student ignored his apology, grabbed his basketball, and threw it to the other end of the court. He said he told the student that it was unnecessary for him to have tossed his ball to the other end of the court. He then said that the male student started a verbal chant of his disagreement with him. The complainant said that he then advised that he would report this matter to the campus administration office and reported it to Clifton Puckett. He also said the other male was silent and that his personal ID information was unknown."

I (Sergeant Grant, R) advised him that I would investigate this matter further and will speak to GHC Student David Lawal about this matter when he arrives back on campus the morning of Wednesday 11/10/2018, and get his side of the story.

On Wednesday 11/10/2018 at approximately 0915 Hours, I spoke to the other involved GHC Student (David Lawal) about this incident and took a completed statement form of his account. He said "On the date, time and location in question he and a friend arrived at the Cartersville Student Center Gym to play a game of basketball. They observed that GHC Student (Christopher McDonald) was already on the court shooting hoops. They then started a shoot around without incident. He said the other student subsequently quit shooting and then left. He and his friend started a one on one game and during the middle of that game the other student apparently returned and without a word or hesitation he started shooting which interrupted their game.

He was concerned that the other student was interrupting their game and before he could respond the basketball had hit him on his arm and so he grabbed it and tossed it to the other end of the gym. He said that he and the other student had a verbal disagreement about who was right or wrong and then the other student left the area when other students started coming around."

For further information and or details, see the enclosed GHC Police Department Statement Forms of those involved. There was no criminal intent or elements present in the outlined incident.

At the time of this incident this police report is for documentation purposes only. During my investigation of this matter, I pulled and reviewed the camera footage relative to this incident and the footage was inconclusive. The footage did confirm that the involved parties were indeed in proximity to this area and each other but there was no indications of inappropriate behavior by either party. This incident was forwarded to the Georgia Highlands College "Office of Student Conduct & Student Services" for further disposition and response as they deem needed.
