PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Minimum of 2.5 GPA in required general academic courses • LPN/Paramedics require a Georgia state license • TEAS required within one year of application (August 2nd - August 1st yearly); applicants can have no more than two attempts at the TEAS in any application cycle - minimum composite: 70 • LPN/Paramedics are eligible to apply for the Traditional ASN program, but Paramedics will require a CNA license, if applying for the Traditional ASN program • Application deadline: August 1st (yearly)

NOTES
* Students must retake required Biology courses if taken more than 6 years before application.
** Practicing LPNs can request a waiver to extend the age of their Biology courses to 10 years - directions available on the Nursing FAQ
*** Students must make at least a C or better in BIOL 2121K, BIOL 2122K, BIOL 2161K, ENGL 1101, and MATH 1001 (or MATH 1111)
**** Upon successful completion of NURS 1300 & NURS 1400, students receive prior learning credit for NURS 1000, 1001, 1002, 1100, and 1200
