- Minimum of 2.5 GPA in required general academic courses.
- Applicants for the bridge program must be finishing their final prerequisites in the **summer semester** of application. This is to ensure applicants will have all prerequisites completed for a competitive admission score.
- LPN/Paramedics require a Georgia state license.
- TEAS required within two years of application (August 2nd August 1st); applicants can have no more than **four** attempts at the TEAS in any application cycle **minimum composite: 70**
- LPN/Paramedics are eligible to apply for the Traditional ASN program the LPN/Paramedic licenses will now be accepted, if applying for the Traditional ASN program
- Application deadline: August 15th (yearly)
- Nursing information sessions are mandatory visit the Nursing website for event information.

- \* Students must make at least a C or better in BIOL 2251/L, BIOL 2252/L, BIOL 2260/L, ENGL 1101, and MATH 1001 (*will accept higher level Math or STAT 1401*).
