PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Minimum of 2.5 GPA in required general academic courses Applicants for the program must be finishing their final prerequisites in the spring semester of application. This is to ensure applicants will have all prerequisites completed for a competitive admission score. Applicants with an active CNA license will receive 100 extra points in their admission score. TEAS required within two years of application (April 2nd - April 1st); applicants can have no more than four attempts at the TEAS in any application cycle - minimum composite: 70 Application deadline: April 1st (yearly) Nursing information sessions are mandatory - visit the Nursing website for event information.

* Students must retake required Biology courses if taken more than 6 years before application.
** Students must make at least a C or better in BIOL 2251/L, BIOL 2252/L, BIOL 2260/L, ENGL 1101, and MATH 1001 (will accept higher level Math or STAT 1401).
*** Students who transfer in HIST 2110 (Survey of US History) will receive points in their admission score. These students MUST complete a course substitution form in order to satisfy their US & GA History requirements for graduation - these are not guaranteed and if denied, students must take either HIST 2111 or 2112.
