# Criminal Justice Pathway/Bachelor of Science in Criminology AN AGREEMENT TO ESTABLISH A TRANSFER ARTICULATION AGREEMENT AND A 2+2 PROGRAM PARTNERSHIP BETWEEN GEORGIA HIGHLANDS COLLEGE AND THE UNIVERSITY OF WEST GEORGIA

This is a Joint Institutional Agreement on the part of Georgia Highlands College (GHC) and the University of West Georgia (UWG) to formally establish an educational partnership between the two institutions. This agreement is made between Georgia Highlands College Division of Social Sciences, Business, and Education regarding the Associate of Arts Criminal Justice Pathway and the University of West Georgia College of Social Sciences regarding the Bachelor of Science in Criminology. In this agreement, GHC and UWG are collectively referred to as the Parties.

The objectives of this Agreement are to provide for a partnership between GHC and UWG that will allow students to enroll at GHC, complete an Associate of Arts degree in the Criminal Justice Pathway, and be eligible to enroll with major status in the Bachelor of Science in Criminology program at UWG, or to provide for full transferability of any credit earned toward the AA for an early transfer to UWG to complete said BS program.

- The Parties will work to identify, recruit and select students who clearly demonstrate academic and personal competencies required to function as successful students in the program.
- Facilitate the transfer of all viable college courses as required in the University System of Georgia core curriculum.
- Facilitate the transfer of AA level credits (GHC) towards completion of BS program (UWG).
- Create a seamless pipeline for AA degree (GHC) to BS degree (UWG)

## Acceptance of Transfer Credit at the University of West Georgia

The following guidelines are used to award transfer credit:

- The transfer of credits is consistent with and subject to the conditions prescribed in each institution's published catalog at the time of the student's transfer request.
- Transferred courses must have been taken Fall Semester 2011 or later and be comparable college-level courses to be equivalent in content and quality to the University of West Georgia.
- Completion of the Associate of Arts Criminal Justice Pathway at Georgia Highlands College does not guarantee admission to the Bachelor of Science in Criminology program at the University of West Georgia. Candidates must successfully meet all requirements to gain admission to the University of West Georgia.
- This agreement will be reviewed annually by both parties to ensure continued transfer compatibility of courses. The agreement is in effect for a period of five years, at which time it may be reviewed and renewed. The agreement can be dissolved at any time by the written request of either of the parties listed above.

- GHC students must complete CRIM 2276 Global Crime and Justice (3) subsequent to transferring to UWG given that GHC does not offer course, which UWG requires in Core Area F. Course will apply toward 12 credit hours of general academic electives for Bachelor of Science in Criminology. Alternatively, students may petition GHC to substitute CRIM 2276 for a Core Area F3 social science elective, and complete as a transient student.
- GHC students must complete remaining Core Area F3 course subsequent to transferring to UWG given that UWG requires all four courses listed in GHC's Core Area F3. Course will apply toward 12 credit hours of general academic electives for Bachelor of Science in Criminology. Alternatively, students may petition GHC to substitute remaining Core Area F3 course for a Core Area F2 social science elective.

eCore courses will be granted equivalency under current eCore-UWG agreements to satisfy Associate degree requirements or transfer course requirements listed above. Equivalencies for eCore and UWG as of February 2019 are as follows:
