

## **An Articulation Agreement Between Georgia Highlands College And The University Of West Georgia**

### **Associate of Arts – Spanish**

#### **Explanation of Agreement:**

This is a Joint Institutional Agreement on the part of Georgia Highlands College (GHC) and the University of West Georgia (UWG) to formally establish an educational partnership between the two institutions. This agreement is made between GHC's School of Humanities regarding the Associate of Arts (AA) Spanish degree and the UWG's College of Arts, Culture, and Scientific Inquiry regarding the Bachelor of Arts (BA) in Foreign Languages and Literatures (Spanish) degree offered in the Department of English, Film, Languages, and Performing Arts. In this agreement, GHC and UWG are collectively referred to as the parties.

The objectives of the agreement are to provide a partnership between GHC and UWG that will allow students to enroll at GHC, complete an AA Spanish degree, and be eligible to enroll with a major status into the BA in Foreign Languages and Literatures (Spanish) in the College of Arts, Culture and Scientific Inquiry at UWG.

The parties will:

- work to identify, recruit, and select students who clearly demonstrate academic and personal competencies required to function as successful students in the program.
- facilitate the transfer of all viable college courses as required in the University System of Georgia core curriculum.
- facilitate the transfer of AA level credits (GHC) towards completion of a BA program (UWG).
- create a seamless pipeline for AA degree (GHC) to BA degree (UWG).

#### **Acceptance of Transfer Credit at the University of West Georgia:**

The following guidelines are used to award transfer credit:

- The transfer of credits is consistent with and subject to the conditions prescribed in each institution's published catalog at the time of the student's transfer request.
- Completion of the AA – Spanish degree at GHC does not guarantee admission to the BA in Foreign Languages and Literatures and/or Foreign Languages and Literatures Certification Track programs at UWG.
- Candidates must successfully meet all requirements to gain admission to the University of West Georgia.

This agreement will be reviewed annually by both parties to ensure continued transfer compatibility of courses. This agreement is in effect for a period of five years, at which time it may be reviewed and renewed. The agreement can be dissolved at any time by the written request of either of the parties listed above.

#### **Requirements**

- Earn an overall GPA of 2.0 at GHC
- Complete requirements for the AA-Spanish degree
